### Update to the Court Registry Information System (CRIS)


The current Court Registry Information System, known as CRIS, has been in place since 1988. Due to its age, it is no longer able to be supported and requires updating.


As a result, the court file information maintained on CRIS is being moved to an updated digital system called A-CRIS. The information relates to civil, family, child protection, appeals to the Court of Appeal of Yukon and the Supreme Court of Yukon, and Small Claims Court matters. The information does not include current or recent criminal matters. Current or historical criminal files continue to be accessible through the Court Registry.

This is an **interim system** to ensure continuity for the Courts and public. The Courts continue to work on the development of a new Civil Case Management System, which will be a modern, digital case management system allowing for e-filing. A-CRIS is a small, interim step in preparation for this larger project.

A-CRIS will be operational on July 21, 2023. Current CRIS users, including those who access CRIS through the designated Yukon Public Law Library computer, will continue to be able to access the same court file data through A-CRIS.
